Admission Guidelines

Candidates are requested to read the admission guidelines carefully before filling the online application form. Candidates who fail to satisfy the application criteria will be rejected.

The college offers B.A./B.Sc. Honours Programmes of Studies (under CBCS) in English, Bengali, Sanskrit, History, Philosophy and Zoology. The college also offers B.A. General Programmes of Studies under CBCS. The guidelines for online admission are as follows:

1. Minimum Eligibility Criteria:

- Honours Programme:** A student who has passed the Higher Secondary (10+2) Examination held by the West Bengal Council of Higher Secondary Education or its equivalent Examination from other Boards / Councils with at least four subjects having English as Compulsory Subject of 100 marks is eligible to take admission to the Honours Programmes of Studies of B.A./B.Sc. on the basis of merit and available vacancy of the particular subject(s) of the concerned college.
- General Programme:** A student who has passed the Higher Secondary (10+2) Examination held by the West Bengal Council of Higher Secondary Education or its equivalent Examination from other Boards/Councils with at least four subjects having English as Compulsory Subject of 100 marks is eligible to take admission to the General Programmes of Studies of B.A./B.Sc. on the basis of merit and available vacancy of the particular subject(s) of the concerned college.
- A student who has passed Higher Secondary (10+2) examinations (with English as a subject) of the West Bengal State Council of Technical & Vocational Education and Skill Development (Erstwhile West Bengal State Council of Vocational Education and Training) or National or State Level Board in regular mode shall be eligible to take admission to the B.A. General Programme only.
- Students, who have passed the Higher Secondary (10+2) examination or its equivalent from All India Boards/Councils or State Boards/Councils including Open Schools and vocational studies, are eligible for study at the UG level. Students from All India Boards/Councils (i.e., CBSE, ISC and National Institute of Open Schooling) are not required to submit Migration Certificate for getting admission to this college.
- Students who have passed the Higher Secondary (10+2) Examinations in the current year (2022), immediate previous year (2021) and the year before the previous year (2020) will only be allowed to take admission.
- 5% and 10% merit point will be deducted from total merit points credited to the students who passed 12th Standard in 2021 and 2020 respectively.
- Aggregate marks shall be calculated by adding the marks in English and top-three subjects in order of marks secured by a candidate.
- The College authorities may fix higher eligibility criteria than the minimum eligibility criteria as laid down in point (a) & point (b).



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2. Application Criteria:

a) A candidate may apply for Honours Programme if only the following conditions are fulfilled in (10+2):

- 55% in the aggregate or 45% in Honours related subject with 50% in the aggregate.
- For SC/ST/PWD applicants, eligibility criterion is 50% in the aggregate or 40% in Honours related subject with 45% in the aggregate.

b) A candidate may apply for General Programme if he/she has passed (10+2) with the minimum qualifying percentage.

3. Reservation of seats:

There shall be reservation of seats for SC / ST / OBC / Differently abled Candidates as per Rules of the State Government.

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5. Calculation of Aggregate Marks and Merit Point:

a) Subject to the eligibility criteria, the merit lists for the Honours Programme will be prepared as:

i. $(S+T)/4$
[Where S = Subject marks (opted for Honours Programme) and T = Marks obtained in English+ best marks of two other subjects (excluding subject opted for Honours Programme)].

ii. In case, any candidate opts for an Honours Programme beyond his/her subject combination [except linguistic subjects at H.S. (10+2) level], the merit point will be calculated as:

$$T1/4$$

[Where T1 = Marks obtained in English + best marks of three other subjects (excluding English)].

b) Subject to the eligibility criteria, the merit lists for the General Programme will be prepared as:

$$T1/4$$

[Where T1 = Marks obtained in English + best marks of three other subjects (excluding English)].

6. Special conditions for admission: A student shall be allowed to take up a subject in Honours / General Programme if he /she has passed in that subject at the previous qualifying examination subject to some exceptions for specified subjects. The detail subject combinations are mentioned below:

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7. Choice of Generic Elective:

- a) For the Six-Semester B. A. / B. Sc. Honours Programmes of Studies, a candidate is required to choose his/her Honours (CORE) in a discipline and two Generic Electives (GE) in two other disciplines from the options given below. No candidate will be allowed to choose the same subject as his/her Honours (CORE) and Generic Electives. GE-1 and GE-2 must be two different subjects. A candidate can choose any one subject as GE-1 from the group of subjects given below in Basket-1 and any other subject as GE-2 from the group of subjects given below in Basket-2.

2. **DC, DSE and GE:** Each course is of 6 credits for course work per week.
Non-practical based course: Theory- 5 credits + Tutorial- 1 credit.
Practical based course: Theory- 4 credits + Tutorial- 2 credits.
1 credit =1 hour duration of teaching (lecture/tutorial) or 2-hour duration of practical period.
3. **AEC and SEC:** Each course is of 2 credits per week.
4. **GE:** An honours student has to study two disciplines (other than honours discipline) as GE having two courses in each discipline.
5. **DSE:** A student has to select two **DSE** courses out of at least three options provided by the main discipline in SEM-V and SEM-VI.
6. **DP:** (Optional) Dissertation / Project Work in lieu of one **DSE-4** in SEM-VI.
7. **MIL:** Modern Indian Language

1. Each course is of 50 marks for examination.
2. **DC/DSE/GE:** Each course is of 6 credits for course work per week.
(Theory- 5 credits + Tutorial- 1 credit)

1 credit =1 hour duration of teaching (lecture/tutorial)
3. **GE:** Covering one discipline other than core disciplines taken with two courses.
4. **SEC:** Covering two core disciplines with two courses.
5. **LC-1 & LC-2:** Two language core disciplines Bengali and English are to be studied taking two courses from each language core.
6. **DSE:** Covering two main disciplines with two courses each. Each discipline will provide option of two courses for one DSE in SEM-V and in SEM-VI. A student has to opt any one out of two courses provided for each DSE.
7. **MIL:** Modern Indian Language
8. Students have to opt 2 different disciplines as core disciplines in SEM-I. Core disciplines once selected in SEM-I should be continued up to SEM-VI without any alternation or change.



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9. Foreign Nationals:

A foreign student will have to show the original certificates of Madhyamik (or its equivalent) Examination and Higher Secondary (or its equivalent) Examination, and the original Passport and Visa at the time of admission. Foreign nationals will have to pay five times higher fees than the Indian nationals.

10. Merit List:

Admission to the courses offered by this college will be granted according to the published merit lists. If any human or mechanical error is found in the merit list, it must be brought to the notice of the college authorities within the dates specified for rectification in the provisional merit list, so that the merit list can be corrected. The corrected merit list will be published at the earliest. After that no other claim or request will be entertained. There is no quota other than ST, SC, OBC-A, OBC-B & PWD. PWD quota will be considered only if suitable candidates are found.

11. Online Admission Details:

a) Application to the Courses offered by S.B.S. Government College, Hili in the Academic Session 2022-2023 must be done online by following the link "ONLINE ADMISSION" after visiting the college portal <http://www.sbsgch.ac.in>. Only online applications will be accepted for admission.

b) A candidate may apply for two subjects in Honours Programme and one subject in General Programme at a time. Candidate should mention his/her order of preference carefully; it may not be changed later. During the selection process the options of higher merit will be considered first, and then the next and so on. Once a candidate is selected for one option (suppose 3rd preference), all the lower options (4th & 5th preference) will be closed, the higher options (1st & 2nd preference) may remain open for future chances. The preference 1 is higher than preference 2 and so on. The candidate should select the subject which he/she will study if he/she gets chance for admission to this college to study that subject as preference 1. Accordingly, 2nd best subject as preference 2 and so on.

- Admit Card of Madhyamik (10th Standard)
- Passport size colour photograph
- Applicant's Signature
- SC/ST/OBC-A/OBC-B Certificate issued by Govt. of West Bengal only
- Medical Certificate of PWD candidate

d) All the documents uploaded by the candidates will be verified before the commencement of class. If the claims of the candidates are found to be false or their documents are not found to be proper, then their admissions will be cancelled, and the seats will be declared empty without refunding their admission fees.
